City of Seattle seeks portable artworks by mid-career artists. Seattle Public Utilities' (SPU) to purchase works for a portable collection.

Artists with at least 10 years of professional experience and a significant exhibition history are encouraged to apply. The call is open to residents of Washington, Oregon, British Columbia or Alaska. Portable works in all art mediums will be considered.

A panel of arts professionals advised by SPU staff will select the artworks for purchase. The total purchase budget is \$100,000 and is supported by SPU One Percent for Art funds.
